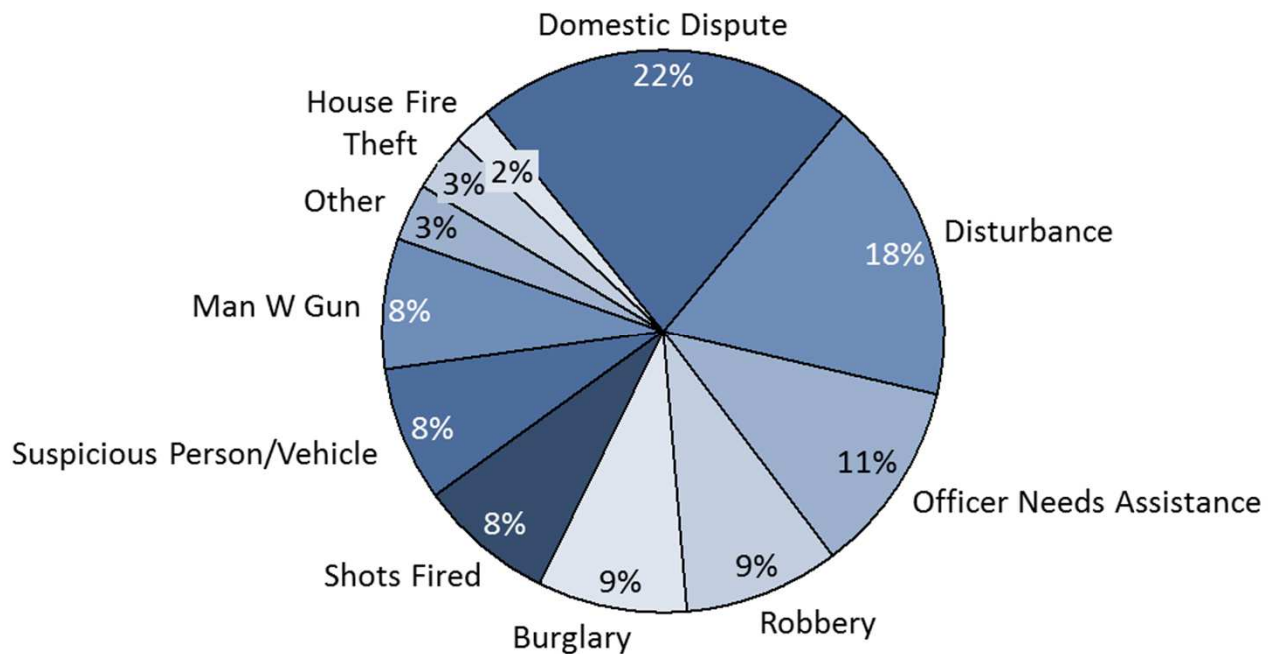




Line of Duty Deaths by Call Type

In a Memorial Fund study of line of duty death cases between 2010 and 2014, 91 cases involved officers who were dispatched to a call for service and killed by a suspect on the scene. Of those, “Domestic Dispute” calls were the most frequent call type that ended in an officer being killed by a suspect.

Many other call types, such as “Shots Fired,” included a domestic dispute component even though they were not originally dispatched as such.
