




Domestic Dispute Calls

In a Memorial Fund study of all line of duty death cases between 2010 and 2014, 132 cases involved officers who were attacked and killed after being dispatched to a call for service or while conducting self-initiated actions such as traffic stops. Domestic Dispute calls were the deadliest call type – representing 22% of all calls where an officer was killed.

Number of Officers On Scene at Time of Line of Duty Death



35% of officers killed at Domestic Dispute calls were alone when killed – 57% were dispatched alone and 43% did not wait for back up before taking action.
